### From the Chief

Greetings to all,

It doesn't seem that it was that long ago I was putting together this letter for 2021. I guess the saying "time flies" certainly has some meaning! 2022 started out to be a long drawn out year but actually flew by but we had some great things happen.

We started out the year with the government choosing our department, along with thousands of others, to partake in and gather data for a program to determine if Medicare/Medicaid payments to departments need



to increase. This data had to be collected for every call we went on whether it was EMS or Fire. Data ranged from hours on call, miles driven, monies paid/collected, district coverage, building spaces, budget numbers and numbers of volunteers per incidents just to name a few. This was a large undertaking for us being volunteer. Many hours were put into this by my officers and Sherri-Lynn. Brittany Johnson came up with a form to be used after every call to collect some of this data. The data was collected all year and then entered into a program and submitted at the beginning of 2023. I feel the group did an excellent job but this is one task we are glad is behind us.

Membership numbers have been down a bit from some folks either retiring, moving or having life get in the way. This is a national problem for many, many Departments so, we put together a "recruitment committee". This committee consisted of 6 members. Two members each from the Fire Commission, EMS and Fire. The group would meet and come up with ideas on how to get new members. I'm happy to say that as of its creation, we have gained 9 new members currently! That is outstanding! Currently 7 members have joined the Fire side and 2 members have joined the EMS side. All are equally valuable! Excellent job and keep them coming in!



The summer of 2022 was an exciting one with regards to grants. A first ever Wisconsin EMS grant was introduced. We applied for this and were swinging for the fence. EMS was awarded \$110,000. With the additional unbudgeted money, we were able to put money into purchasing a new ambulance, a new Lucas device, needed upgrades in protective equipment and incentives in recruitment and retention. Again, great work by my EMS Chiefs!

We also applied for grant money thru Forest Fire Protection grant thru the DNR. This is a 50% match in a variety of categories from personal protective equipment, tool, radios, skids and vehicles all related to wildland firefighting. We purchased a new fire/EMS skid for the UTV we purchased in 2021. This was an \$8000 unit and we received \$4000 in grant money.

We also applied for the federal Assistance to Firefighters Grant that we do every year. There are many large dollar items that need attention. Radios, SCBA's and aging vehicles are the categories we focus on. We were unsuccessful the first round but reapplied and are waiting on notification. Equipment in the Fire Service is terribly expensive. Any help we can get in funding great!

Not everything was positive in 2022. In November the Community and the Department lost an Icon... Don Mack passed away at the age 87. Donny was the voice of the Service for so many years. Answering every page, Fire and EMS, everyday. "314 acknowledges the page". He was on call for EMS 24/7/365 for 30+ years. One of the most dedicated individuals I've ever had the privilege to meet! Don retired in November of 2017 after 38 years of service. Even after retiring, Don was not a stranger. He would make laps 5-6 times a day. Always keeping an eye on things. The Fire Department was his love. We will be retiring his number later this year. R.I.P. 314!

Let's end on a positive note. 2022 saw an increase in volunteers that are really blending well and taking the bull by the horns. Lot's of action at the station with classes which will continue thru 2023. Awarded grant money. Purchase of a new Ambulance. Positive updates on new Engine(arriving in 2023). Finally, the drive to do positive things for others.

I am not here for me, I am here for we, and we are here for them! Here's to 2023!

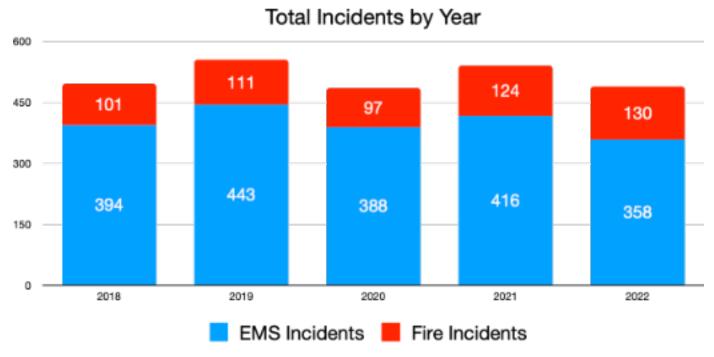

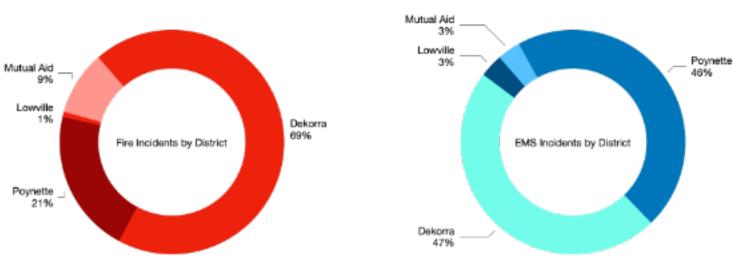

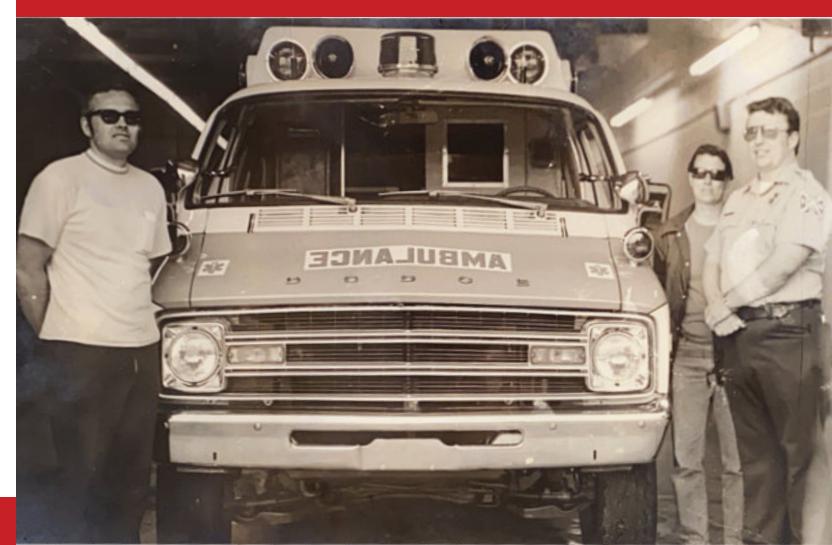
### **RESPONSE DISTRICT**



The Poynette Dekorra Fire Protection District provides fire and EMS services for a 50-square-mile service area that includes 3 municipalities serving more than 5,500 people. We are a rural community located approximately 30 miles northeast of the capital city of Madison, in Columbia County, in south-central Wisconsin. Within the district are the major national and state transportation corridors of I-90/94-39, US 51, and the Canadian Pacific Railroad lines. The Poynette rest areas are the only rest areas in U.S. located on three concurrent Interstate Highways and are the most used in the state. Lake Wisconsin, a dam-controlled major recreational area also has emergency needs serviced by our department.

The Poynette Dekorra Fire Protection District fire inspectors, lead by head inspector Ernie Koepp inspect each business locations in the fire district twice each year. This ensures that the business meet the fire code and allows us an opportunity to provide citizen fire safety education. This not only increases the safety of both our citizens and firefighters but also



allows us to collect the 2% dues from the state of Wisconsin. In 2022 this accounted for \$23,496 in revenue.
