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From the Chief



Greetings to all,

Another year has come and gone. It seems the older I get the faster the years go. A lot has happened at PDFD this past year. We have acquired a couple of new apparatus, moved forward with a new “live fire” training prop, done tons of training, picked up a few new members and responded to 25% more calls than last year.

In Q3 of 2022, Poynette-Dekorra EMS was awarded a grant through the State of Wisconsin for \$110K. In Q2 of 2023, we reaped the benefits of the hard work put in by EMS Assistant Chiefs Paul Schwanbeck and Brittany Johnson. We took delivery of a new Type 1 4x4 Ambulance to replace a 2010 model. We were able to buy new jumpsuits for all EMS members, A new LUCAS device was purchased to assist during CPR calls. Some recruitment and retention needs were also met thanks to that grant. A hat’s off to our EMS leaders.

We also updated the Fire Fleet with a 2023, 2000 gpm Engine that replaced a 1998 Engine. This is a Sutphen chassis with the truck being built by Custom Fire Apparatus Inc. This piece of equipment will be first out on most every call and will do so for the next 20 years. To help outfit this Engine, the Poynette Area Community Endowment (PACE) group graciously awarded both Fire and EMS a total of \$23K thru a first year grant. They will continue to award grants to non profit groups for the next 10 years. We upgraded our extrication equipment with new battery operated tools built by TNT. They are built in Wisconsin and have a lifetime warranty.

Training has been the main focus this year. Members have been taking Entry Level FireFighter I, Firefighter I and Firefighter II. HazMat Operations, EMT basic and Fire Officer I were also taken. These classes are above and beyond the weekly mandatory training. Some of these classes were held here at the station. New Officers are required to take Fire Officer I and some members upgraded their certification of EMR to EMT-B. You can never get enough good, quality training!

Poynette Fire and EMS responded to 25% more calls this year than last year. EMS responded to 478 calls in 2023 vs 358 in 2022. That's an incredible 120 more calls. Fire responded to 155 calls in 2023 vs 130 in 2022. That’s 25 more calls. As a Department, we responded to 633 calls in 2023 against 488 in 2022. Some of this is

attributed to MABAS and a major summer storm.

Due to MABAS, Poynette responded to 24 structure fires. This is up from 16 last year. A major one of note was the Columbia County Recycling Center. Two fires in 10 days with the 2nd being the largest. For Poynette it was 14 hrs, 450,000 gallons pumped and 15 water shuttles totaling 45,000 gallons hauled in from other areas. Poynette EMS was also on scene offering rehab for the firefighters.

A major summer storm ripped through Poynette and parts of Dekorra in late July downing trees and powerlines all across the district. This storm generated 11 calls in a roughly 2 hour period. Had the storm done more damage to downtown, we would have had to initiate the Emergency Operations Plan. It took a month to clean up.

A final note on calls. December was a record month. 52 calls for EMS and 11 calls for Fire. What makes this stand out is, the week between Christmas and New Year's, EMS responded to 28 calls and Fire had 7 calls. Some days there were 7-8 calls.

We now have two pieces of antique equipment in our possession. A 1925 REO Fire Truck and a 1914 HOWE horse drawn pumper. Both are in the process of being refurbished. The HOWE pumper was re-acquired from Pete and Margo Holzman in July. The refurbishing projects are being overseen by our 53 year veteran Ernie Koepp.

As you can see, 2023 has been full of opportunities. There is great morale, great attendance and many are fully invested in the direction we're headed.

Here's to a great 2024!

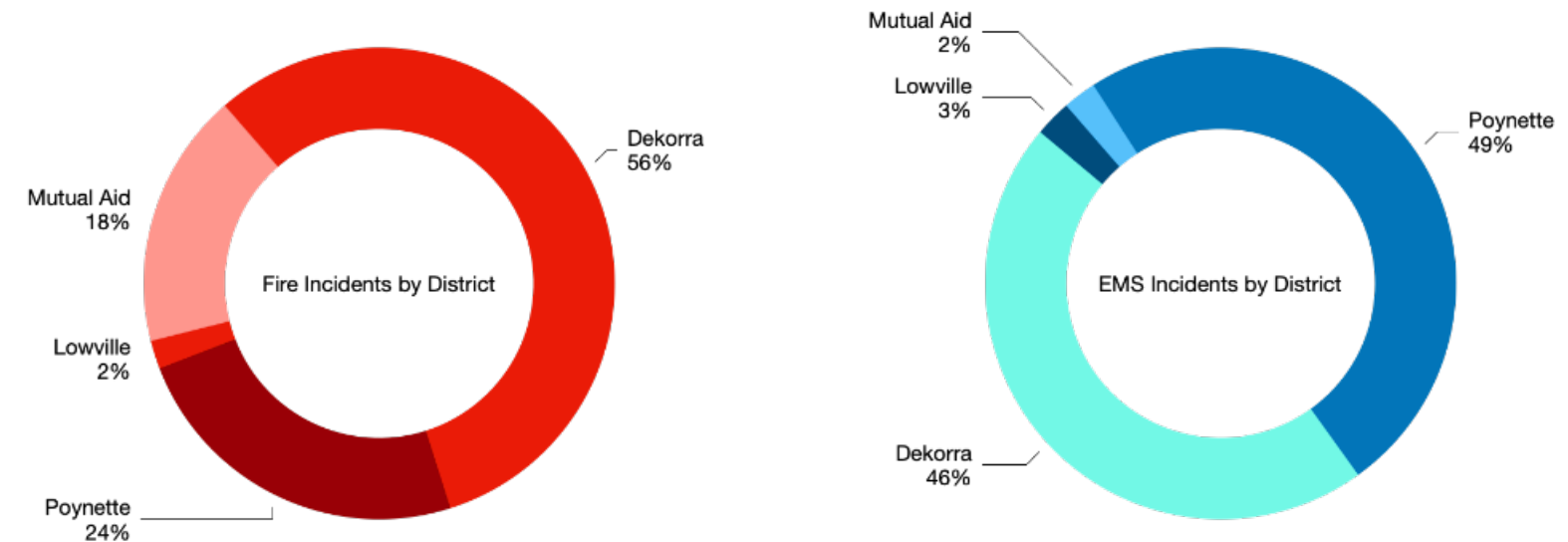
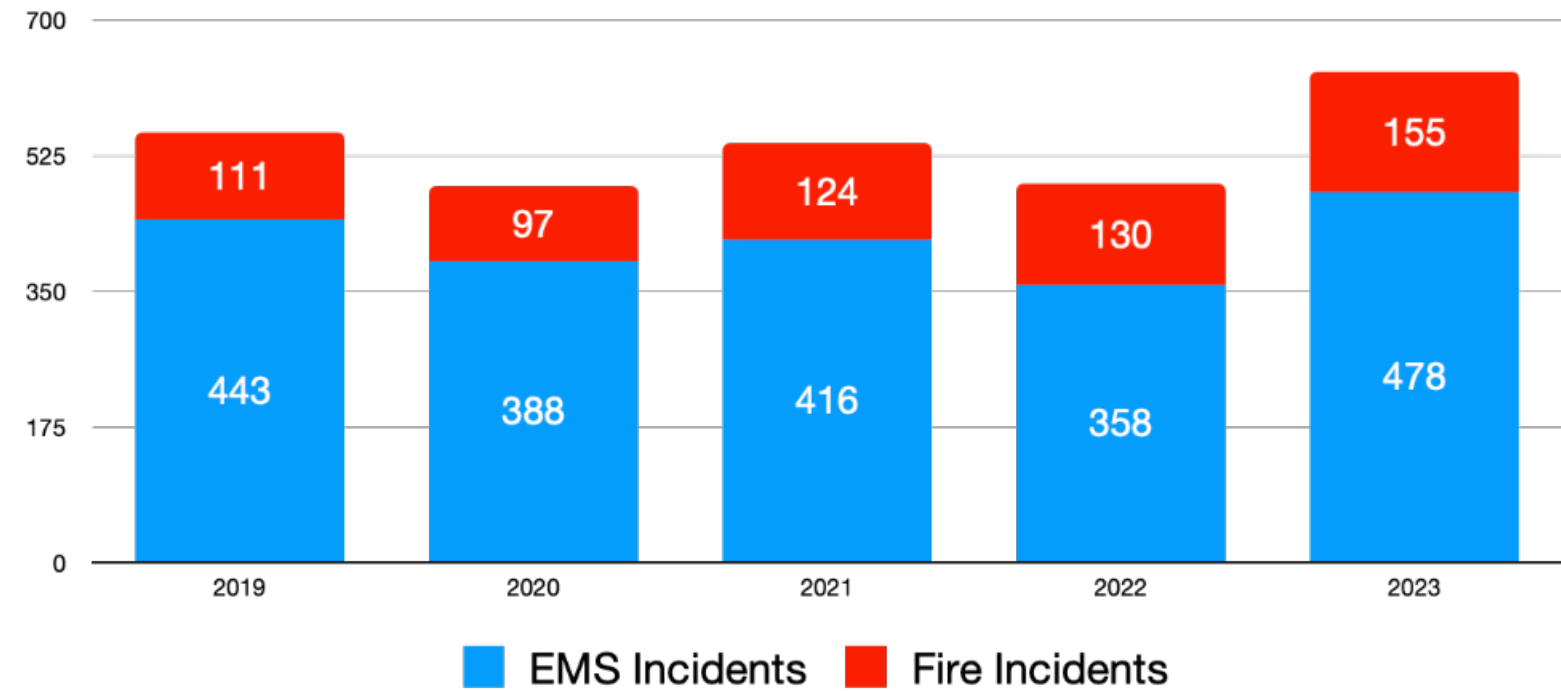

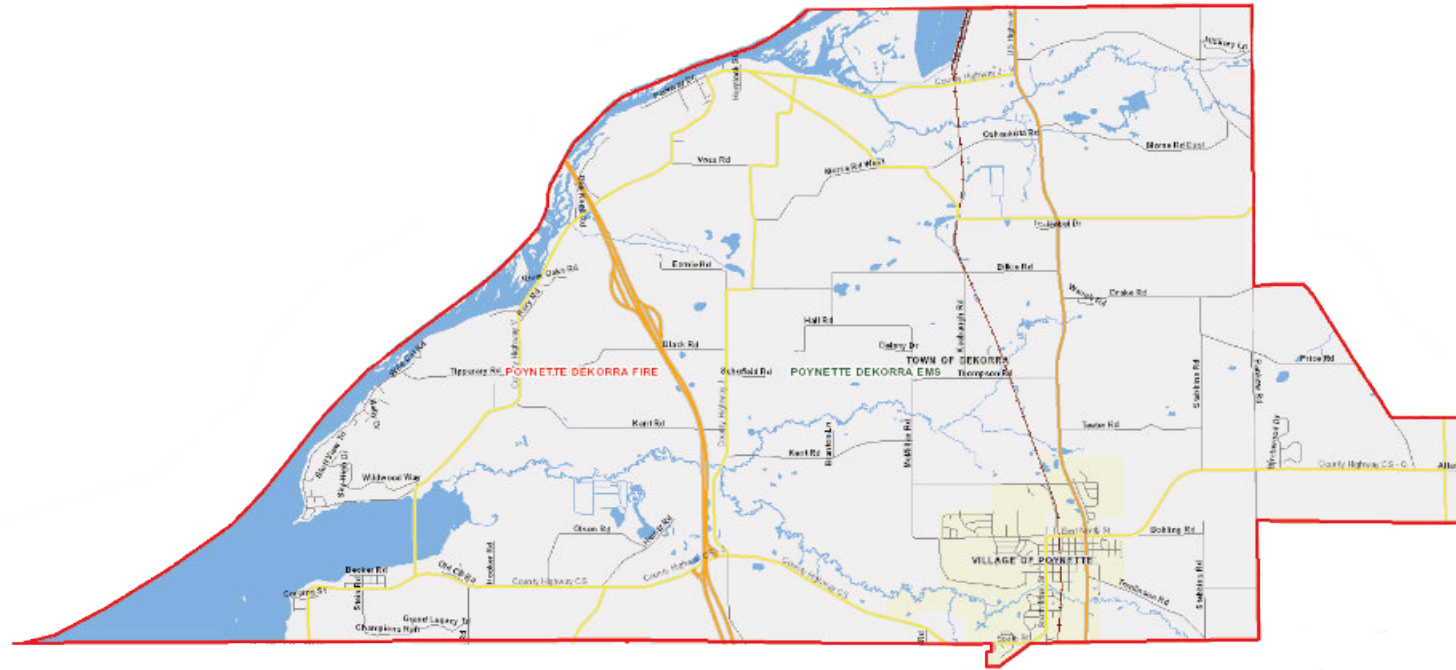

RESPONSE DISTRICT



The Poynette Dekorra Fire Protection District provides fire and EMS services for a 50-square-mile service area that includes 3 municipalities serving more than 5,500 people. We are a rural community located approximately 30 miles northeast of the capital city of Madison, in Columbia County, in south-central Wisconsin. Within the district are the major national and state transportation corridors of I-90/94-39, US 51, and the Canadian Pacific Railroad lines. The Poynette rest areas are the only rest areas in U.S. located on three concurrent Interstate Highways and are the most used in the state. Lake Wisconsin, a dam-controlled major recreational area also has emergency needs serviced by our department.
