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From the Chief

Greetings to all,

As we close the book on 2024, I would like to recap on some of the highlights of our year. Again, we had a busy year with a lot of things to be proud of. Saying it was a busy year means we did 159 Fire calls and 429 EMS calls. That's 588 total calls or 1.6 calls per day. Something or someone required our services on average more than once every day of the year.



What a better way to start the year than to be awarded some grant money to purchase much needed equipment that isn't funded thru the budget. The Poynette Area Community Endowment (PACE) awarded the Fire and EMS departments funding of \$10K for radios for the Fire side and \$25K for a LUCAS device for EMS. A LUCAS device is a machine that does compressions in conjunction with CPR. This device can do the work of 2-4 First Responders. This is extremely important as we now have a LUCAS on each ambulance. We are very fortunate to have this funding available in our community.

We also continue to apply for other grants that are available. Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG), EMS- Funding Assistance Program (FAP), Firehouse Subs grant and Compeer Financial Grant. With the AFG grant we applied for two separate ones – an SCBA grant worth \$280K and a regional grant with four other Departments for radios at \$180K. We were unsuccessful in the first round but applied again in late November and are awaiting the results. EMS FAP grant we were awarded around \$8000. EMS applied for a Firehouse sub grant but were unsuccessful. The Compeer Financial Grant was applied for by EMS and was awarded \$4000 for pagers.

2024 also brought us ISO and 2% Due audits. These are audits that happen every five (5) years. The ISO looks at all aspects of your Department (geography, equipment, training, personnel and structure fires), your water system and the Dispatch Center. We did very well and kept our Class 3 rating in the Village and Just missed moving to Class 5 from a Class 6 in Dekorra. As far as the 2% Due audit, this is also done every five (5) years. This is done by the State and looks at Fire Prevention, Fire Inspections, member training, facilities, equipment and risk analysis. We were in substantial compliance with their findings. A lot of information was obtained for these Audits and my Officers did a great job assisting with that.

We as a Fire Company were able to finish the refurbishment of two pieces of antique apparatus - a 1925 REO Speedwagon Fire Truck and a 1914 HOWE horse drawn pumper. This was done by some talented members of our community, members of our Department and businesses in our District. Ernie Koepp oversaw both projects.

The second half of our year brought new members to our rosters. From July to December we picked up eleven (11) members. Seven (7) for Fire and four (4) for EMS. The new EMS members all came with licenses and were able to make effects right away.

With the additions of the new members and the EMS Chiefs getting creative with the stipends and incentive money to make the pay a little more attractive, the weekly/monthly schedules were upwards of 98% full. Way to go EMS crews! It's a great feeling as a Fire Chief to know the shifts are covered day and night and we still call ourselves "volunteer". I guess a better term now is "paid on call". The new Fire members have been great additions as well. Some had some certifications and some didn't. We had a great year of training and adding certifications to our ranks. From the firefighters to the Officers, we all gained something this year.

I continue to push the importance of having relationships with our Police Department, the Sheriff's Department and our neighboring Fire and EMS Departments. Law Enforcement is typically on scene first and working together and having that trust is huge. MABAS continues to be the norm for mutual aid. Working and training with your neighbors brings a trust level as well. We're all here to help and assist one another.

We will continue to move forward and do the best we can for the people of our Communities.

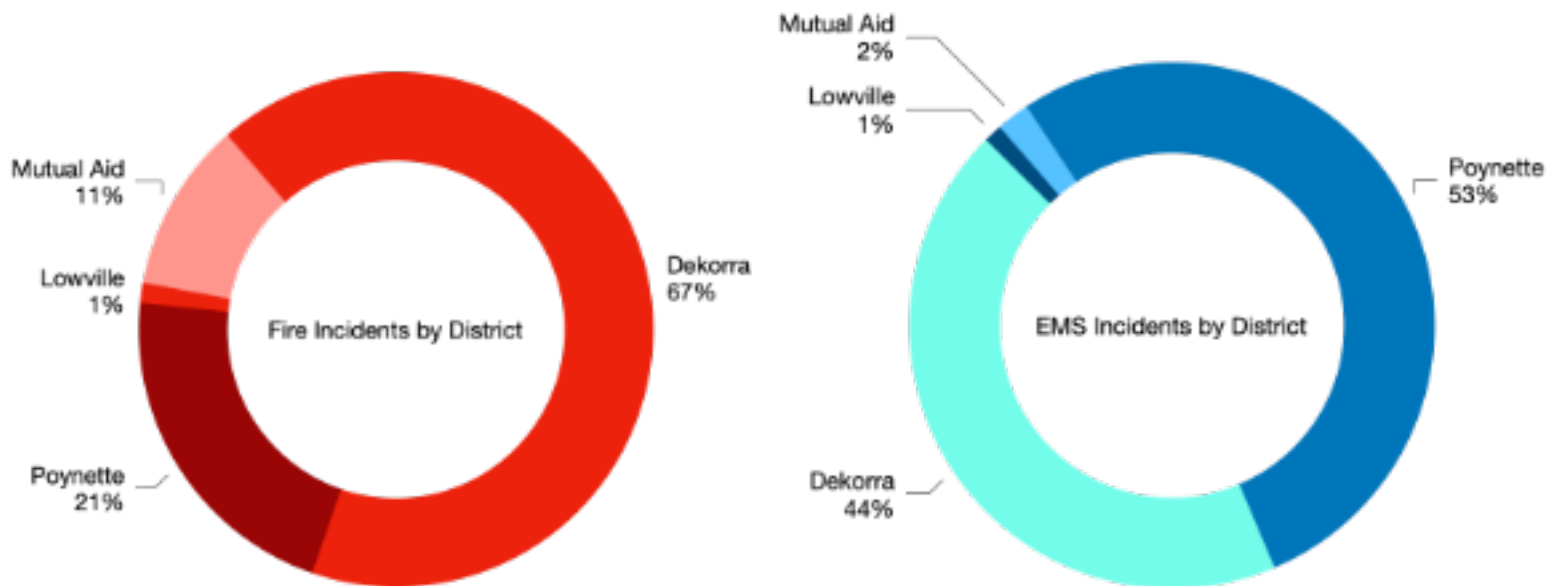
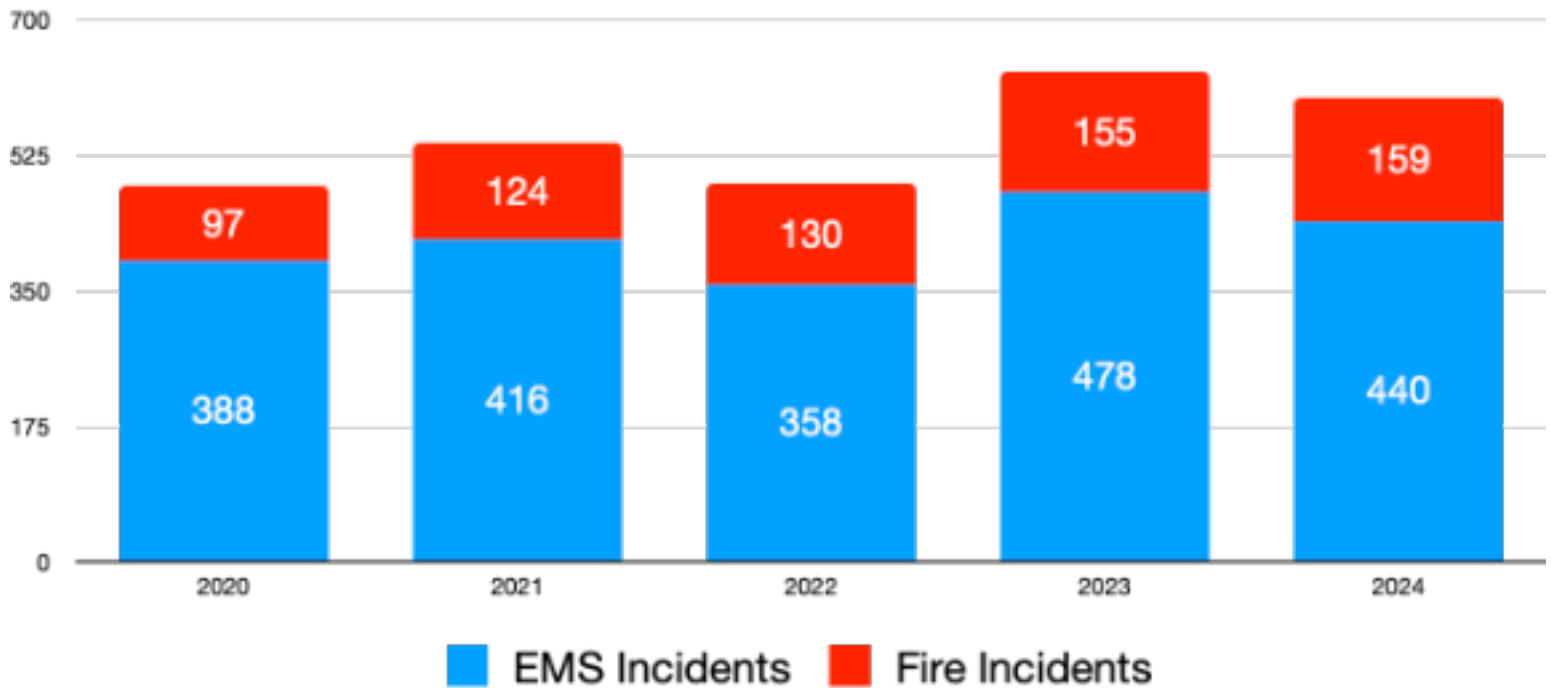

RESPONSE DISTRICT



The Poynette Dekorra Fire Protection District provides fire and EMS services for a 50-square-mile service area that includes 3 municipalities serving more than 5,500 people. We are a rural community located approximately 30 miles northeast of the capital city of Madison, in Columbia County, in south-central Wisconsin. Within the district are the major national and state transportation corridors of I-90/94-39, US 51, and the Canadian Pacific Railroad lines. The Poynette rest areas are the only rest areas in U.S. located on three concurrent Interstate Highways and are the most used in the state. Lake Wisconsin, a dam-controlled major recreational area also has emergency needs serviced by our department.
